# An Overview of the Organization

### **OUR IDENTITY:**

Gonpada Navjeevan Welfare Trust (GNWT) is a social work unit and a non-profit entity, legally established in 2018. With the motto of the Trust being "Rebuilding Lives through Humanitarian Services", the Trust aims to improve the standards of human life through human resource development, community welfare schemes, skill-based developments, outreach, and awareness programmes.

### **TARGET AREA:**

At present GNWT has been working amongst the vulnerable population in 34 villages belonging to Alikosa GP-1, Tarurai GP-2, Manoharpur GP-3, Ranisorai GP-10, and Julbalda GP panchayats of West Medinipur district, West Bengal.

### **VISION:**

To create a Just, Equitable, and Self-Sustainable Society.

### **MISSION:**

The Trust aims to provide a platform for HOLISTIC LIVING through agro-economic ventures. The Trust also aims to BUILD COMMUNITY through sociological, cultural, and educational innovations, and provide QUALITY HEALTH CARE through medical assistance and nutrition programmes.

### **OBJECTIVES:**

Social:

- To promote gender equality and women empowerment through Self-Help Groups (SHGs).
- To uphold peace and justice by bridging the gap between the haves and have-nots.
- To create an awareness about climate change and the need for immediate and consented action.

**Economical:** 

• To alleviate poverty and achieve zero hunger through small scale income generating / livelihood programmes.

**Educational:** 

• To provide and promote quality education through formal and non-formal educational and skill development initiatives.

• To offer remedial classes for the deprived, the marginalized as well as for school dropouts. **Medical:** 

- To promote better health through nutrition programs.
- To offer medical assistance and to collaborate with healthcare units for referral services.

# **GNWT Outreach Through Sector Specific Areas**

The Trust has 5 sector specific areas under which it promotes diverse range of activities to ensure community development. The Sector Specific Areas and the activities undertaken under it are presented below:

### **SECTOR-SPECIFIC AREA 1: Education and Skill Development**

Education is one of the decisive factors that determine the quality of a person's life. Therefore, GNWT aims to improve people's quality of life through initiatives in the sphere of formal and non-formal education. Through Education and Skill Development the Trust organizes various activities to combat the issues of dropouts, unemployment, migration, and livelihood through initiatives such as establishing insecurity remedial units for school going children, enrolling backward children in school, arranging scholarships and other supports for the education of economically underprivileged children, helping youth enroll in professional courses such as Nursing, B- Pharmacy, Hotel management, D. El. Ed, ITI, offering spoken English and basic computer training programmes to empower rural youth entering the job market, establishing mobile tailoring centers in the villages for women to help in income generation, organizing career guidance and conscientization programmes for children, youth and women and collaborating with various institutions to help rural youth to undergo various skill development programs such as civil and electrical engineering, driving, plumbing, tailoring, cosmetology, teaching, nursing etc. The Trust also







conducts exposure visits for children and youth as well as sports and extracurricular activities.

	Ongoing Outreach Activities
1.	Imparting value based compensatory education with growth-oriented opportunities to 27 needy school-going children through 4 remedial units at Bejda with 12 students, Sayapara with 9 students and Nahapar with 6 students.
2.	Imparted 2 months intensive computer literacy and spoken English classes to 68 children/ youth till date.
3.	Enrolling and re-enrolling of children (orphan/ backward) and dropout children in school. The Trust enrolled 9 children in this financial year. Till date the Trust has enrolled and re- enrolled 25 children to school.
4.	Empowering women and youth from remote villages through skill development by imparting 3 months Tailoring Training through Mobile Tailoring Centres. The Trust till date has completed tailoring training in Bejda and Fatehpur Villages and is currently running in Manoharpur and Jhatia Village. A total of 105 women and youth have benefited from this skill development initiative. The Trust also supported 10 needy women with sewing machine or financial aid to be able to empower themselves through this house-hold friendly income opportunity this year.
5.	Motivating more than 150 youth from target villages to enroll themselves for various

professional courses in Nursing, B- Pharmacy, Hotel management, D. El. Ed, ITI, etc., short term courses and peruse higher education. 39 students have enrolled in nursing within the financial year 2021-2022, while 14 Nursing Students have been successfully placed in good hospitals. 2 youths who had perused Hotel Management have been placed in Dubai and are working there.

6. Conduct awareness programs and workshops every Saturday on various issues and important days related to education, health, career, personality development, social issues as well as governmental provisions for children youth and women in the target villages. Till date the Trust has conducted awareness programmes for children, youth and women in more than 30 villages of Narayangarh, Keshiary and Dantan 1 district of West Medinipur. The Trust conducted Youth Animation Program for 30 youths, Career Guidance Program for 80 youths and Rural Teacher's Seminar for 40 teachers.

### **SECTOR-SPECIFIC AREA 2: Women Empowerment and Capacity Building**

The fifth Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) states, "Gender equality is not only a fundamental human right, but it is also a necessary foundation for a peaceful, prosperous, and sustainable world." GNWT believes that Self-Help Group (SHG) centric activities will bring about a dignified life to women. Under Women Empowerment and Capacity Building the Trust seeks to empower women socially, economically, psychologically, and help to lead a dignified life by helping the nonfunctional Self-Help Groups (SHGs) to function and by supporting women from backward and marginalised communities to form new SHGs. The Trust organises regular SHG training programs to enhance planning, performance, leadership, and solidarity among women. The training programs aim at conscientizing women on the need for ebanking, record keeping, and the knowledge of new schemes of SHG and providing training on livelihood activities like tailoring, animal husbandry, poultry, fishery, bamboo craftmanship, mushroom cultivation and new agricultural methods and techniques. The animators conduct constant follow ups as well as workshops with the SHGs to



guide them, for doubt clearance and awareness on social issues. GNWT has successfully established 19 SHGs within the target villages and imparted Capacity Building and SHG oriented training to 190 women.

Ongoing Outreach Activities			
1.	Imparting awareness through seminars, workshops and follow ups with the old and new SHG women on various social issues and government schemes and provisions and assist them in the proper functioning of their SHGs, making right use of their loan amount, bookkeeping and livelihood activities.		
2.	Conducting meeting with women in the target villages and encourage them to form SHGs by making them aware of the benefits of forming SHG groups and imparting training to them.		
3.	The Trust conducted Capacity Building Training Program with 46 women from 10 SHGs and SHG Interactive session with UDAYANI with 80 SHG women.		

4. The Trust conducted Women's Day Celebration at Bamanpukur and Khatnagar which had a total of 900 SHG women participants.
5. The Trust Animators make regular visits to the Block Office and the Panchayat to learn about Schemes and Provisions and create rapport with the local government bodies.

### **SECTOR-SPECIFIC AREA 3: Nutrition, Health, and Hygiene**

GNWT's nutrition and health-based intervention is to change the underlying social health condition of the community and dwellers. Under Nutrition, Health, and Hygiene the Trust aims to change the underlying social and health condition of the community dwellers. GNWT intervenes by conducting programs such as nutrition programme and health camps for malnourished children and for diseased, lactating, and pregnant mothers and elderly in collaboration with Nursing and Government Hospitals. Not only these, GNWT also provided emergency and disaster relief in events such as the Covid-19 and Amphan Cyclone by providing food commodities and medication.





#### **Ongoing Outreach Activities** 1. The Trust conducts awareness camps on diet, nutrition and hygiene, sanitization, metabolic disorders, both infectious and non-infectious diseases, family planning, prenatal and post-natal childcare, adolescent health for girl child and social and economic issues that affect health. 2. The Trust provides referral services, emergency transport service as well as financial assistance to the needy for treatment or purchase of medicines. The Trust has supported 21 needy families/ individuals with emergency transport services and medical expenses this year. During the Covid-19 pandemic (2021 - 2022), the Trust has supported 30 elderly, 3. physically challenged and diseased individuals along with 150 needy families under Covid Relief Program, 25 needy families under Covid 19 Nutritional Support to The Needy and 150 flood effected families with dry food kits in collaboration with the benefactors. The Trust organizes health camps in collaboration with Private and Government 4. Hospital. This year the Trust conducted one Free Eye Camp in collaboration with St. Joseph's Hospital, Medinipur benefiting 90 participants.

### **SECTOR-SPECIFIC AREA 4: Livelihood Programmes**

Considering advancements in all sectors of life, livelihood insecurity, unemployment, and migration are on the rise. Skill gaps and rampant illiteracy often forces the youth to mortgage their land and other assets for securing funds, the consequence of which is an unending debt-trap. GNWT addresses this issue by promoting **Livelihood Programmes** and offering skill-based training to help youth make a decent living. GNWT offers skill-based training to men and women on animal husbandry, poultry, fishery, mushroom cultivation, bamboo craftsmanship, and tailoring, conduct regular workshops on scientific paddy cultivation, orchard keeping, kitchen gardening, vermin-composting, Scientific Rice Intensification method etc. with the help of experts to promote productive and sustainable agricultural practices and avail necessary resources to help youth to venture into income-

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generating small-scale business. GNWT has established tailoring units in different villages that helps women and youth gain a reasonable income.



Ongoing Outreach Activities			
1.	Imparting awareness through workshops and follow ups to more than 300 farmers/ localities in agriculture (organic farming, kitchen garden, orchard, Scientific Rice Intensification method), animal husbandry (Chicken, ducks, goats, and pigs), mushroom cultivation and fishery. The Trust also provided expert support to 40 farmers for practical demonstrations and improved results.		
2.	Conducting vaccination for livestock in collaboration with the BLDO, Animal Health Centre and Prani Mitras.		
3.	The Trust conducted two SRI (Scientific Rice Intensification) Training by UPL with altogether 83 participants and Animation Program for Tailoring Trainees with 26 participants.		
4.	The Trust inaugurated mobile tailoring centres at Fatehpur and Jhatia and a Tailoring Centre at Manoharpur which will provide tailoring training in each village for 3 months.		
5.	The Trust Animators make regular visits to the Block Office, BLDO, ADO and the Panchayat to learn about Schemes and Provisions and create rapport with the local government bodies		

### **SECTOR-SPECIFIC AREA 5: Preservation and Protection of Environment**

GNWT undertakes eco-friendly initiatives with an aim to **Preserve and Protect the Environment** and the available natural resources for future generations. The Trust also gives awareness on forest and land rights and promotes activities that reduce pollution and safeguard the environment. The Trust has given awareness on the importance of promoting eco-friendly approach for traditional

livelihood activities by advocating the use of vermin-composting, distribution of organic seeds, organic manure, encouraging crop- rotation, and water efficient irrigating practices, encouraging lesser use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides, and promoting the use of reusable and recyclable resources that pose less threat to the environment like- cloth articles, paper items, bamboo goods, leaf plates etc. Trainings imparted over the years have



helped participants to not only adopt practices promoting judicious use of natural resources, but also share the knowledge gained with his/ her fellow beings. Trainings imparted over the years have helped participants to not only adopt practices promoting judicious use of natural resources, but also share the knowledge gained with his/ her fellow beings. Most of the farmers have adopted organic practices and attend regular training to learn about products available in the markets. This has resulted in wise selection of less harmful products and alternative practices like- vermin composting. Although the fruit of organic farming is time- taking but most of them have implemented the knowledge shared and have reaped satisfactory output from it.

5.	The Trust Staff conducted a Cleanliness Drive at Dantan Hospital on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti 2021.		

Apart from these activities, GNWT conducts constant surveys, observations and follow ups to keep up with the changes taking place in the community and the arising needs of the community dwellers and to evaluate the impact of the outreach activities on the beneficiaries. GNWT also conducts activities related to the need of the hour such as relief activities during the time Covid-19 crisis and Amphan Cyclone. GNWT also provided material and financial assistance to the needy. This year the Trust has conducted various staff training programs and exposure programs to allow them to observe, learn and enhance their skills and practice. GNWT last but not the least also observes special days of national and international importance such as Women's Day, Girl Child Day, World Literacy Day, International Worker's Day, World Environment Day, World Day Against Domestic Violence, Independence Day, International Day of the World's Indigenous People, Children's Day and many more. Overall, GNWT aims to cover all the sectors where the community is lacking to cater to its holistic growth and development.

2.	21- 25.06 2021	The Trust had organised a 5-day Intensive Employee Training Programme for the staff members at GNWT Office to ensure acquisition of essential skills, effective execution, and management of the projects, enhance team performance as well as to establish an effective channel of communication. The training was conducted online and methods like discussion, presentation, and Participatory Action Approach were used to make it interactive. The staff was trained on their unique role in the management and execution of the projects and other thematic activities.	
3.	24.06.2021	The GNWT Secretary attended an open-ended discussion organized by the leaders of All India Ho Samaj group at GNWT office to draw a conclusion to the problems related to ST and SC's entitlement to the welfare services. The discussion helped to identify drawbacks like- lack of awareness, fear or feeling of inferiority and the act of suppression of the voice raisers that withheld backwards community dwellers from availing the benefits under various socio- economic schemes. The members then collectively decided to write a request letter for the following services addressing the Chief Minister of West Bengal, India requesting provision for: 1. Clean and safe drinking water 2. Construction of proper drainage system 3. Enrolment of ST/SC villagers under MGNREGA scheme	
4.	30. 06. 2021	COVID-19 Relief Programme for 150 families. was conducted in collaboration with Missionaries of Charity Sisters, Kearchand for 150 needy families from the target villages at Bamanpukur. The families were supported with dry food kit items, like- rice, pulses, sugar, tea leaves, cooking oil, soya chunks and biscuit.	
5.	30. 06. 2021	Observation of Adivasi Hul Diwas. 30 <sup>th</sup> June 2021 is observed among the tribal's as "'Hul Kranti Diwas', the GNWT Staff recalled the selfless- sacrifice of the martyrs of Santhal rebellion- Sidhu and Kanhu Murmu. MC Sister Superior, GNWT Secretary and the Local Superior and the villagers offered flower to the martyrs of Santhal Rebellion, as a tribute to their sacrifice of life for the Adivasi people.
